From the President, Justin Pittman



Casting Competition Jim Rainey

The Cumberland Valley Chapter of Trout Unlimited will be hosting its Annual Mid Atlantic Fly Casting & Fly Tying Championships on June 20th, 2015 at Allenberry Resort in Boiling Springs, PA. The Pennsylvania Fly Fishing Museum will host the competitions in conjunction with its 13th Annual Heritage Day Celebration. The Heritage Day event is a full day of celebrating the fly fishing heritage in the State of Pennsylvania with over 60 venders and exhibitors, hands on demonstrations, special seminars, instruction, raffles, auctions and the always popular Fish Swim Race on the Yellow Breeches for a chance to win \$500! The fly tying competition is open to all with categories for Men, Women and Youth along with an Open Division. Competitors are asked to submit sample flies with their entry and will be judged by the flies they tie on the day of the contest. Full details and contest rules will be available on CVTU's website at www.pacvtu.org. There is no fee to enter any of the amateur classes while the Open Division entry fee is \$25. Open Division entrants will be competing for cash prizes while the winning juniors, amateur women and men will be awarded with merchandise prizes and plaques.

Along with the fly tying contest, CVTU in association with the Chesapeake Council of the International Federation of Fly Fishers, will also host a 5-weight fly casting competition. This contest is also open to all with categories for men, women and youth along with an Open Division for experienced guides, instructors professionals. Competitors will be challenged by both accuracy and distance tasks with winners determined by the highest combined score. All winning competitors will receive plaques along with merchandise prizes. The entrance fee is \$25 for pre-registration, postmarked by June 12, 2015, or you can sign up the day of the event for \$30. Winter Fly Tying Classes By Alan Stansbury

CVTU will again offer winter Fly Tying Classes. We will be conducting both beginner and intermediate/advanced sessions simultaneously. Beginners will learn to tie 8 flies that will progressively build the skills needed to learn fly tying and will also then be armed with effective flies for the upcoming trout season. Intermediate/advanced tiers will participate in a separate workshop setting where CVTU and other guest tiers will demonstrate some of their favorite patterns and techniques.

The course will be offered in conjunction with the South Middleton Township Parks & Recreation Department and will be held at the Boiling Springs High School. The program will begin on Thursday, January 22, 2015, and will meet on Thursday evenings from 7-9 PM for 8 sessions, with the last session on March 12.

Each class will be limited to 20 students, advanced registration will be required, and a nominal fee will be charged for the course. The fee is \$11 for South Middleton Township residents and \$14 for non-residents if you register prior to January 9th, 2015. After January 8th, the cost increases to \$21 and \$24 respectively. In addition, for beginning tiers, a fly tying material and hook kit and instructional materials will be provided for the 8 patterns that will be taught.

A list of patterns and required materials will be provided in advance for intermediate/advanced tiers that will identify patterns to be demonstrated and any materials that will be supplied. Tiers enrolled in these sessions will be responsible for

obtaining any special materials that are not provided.

All individuals and families are welcome, and registration will begin the week of December 21st. Registration can be completed on-line through the "Parks and Recreation Online Program Registration" link via: http://www.smiddleton.com or by calling 717-258-4441.

This is an outstanding opportunity for a beginning fly tier to learn under the direction of experienced tiers and for experienced tiers to further improve their skills with the added benefit of curing some winter cabin fever and stocking their fly boxes for the upcoming season!

Fly of the Month ISO Wiggle Nymph By Jason Minnich

One of my favorite ways to catch fish is on the swing. Typically most trout fisherman immediately think of soft hackles and streamers when they hear this word. The majority of the time a good deaddrifted presentation of a nymph will do the trick whether it is under an indicator or "high sticking". There are, however, numerous nymphs that swim almost as good as minnows and many others that display very erratic movements in their accent to the surface. I'm a true believer that a good number of fish present in these situations key in on this erratic, swimming movement as the nymphs move either up or to the side emerging on streamside rocks and vegetation. This pattern mimics the Isonychia or Slate Drake mayfly, but there are a number of mayflies that you could modify this pattern to match. The first time I heard of the "wiggle nymph" was on a Lake Erie tributary fishing for steelhead. By the way, it is a deadly pattern for picky steelhead and is mostly tied to imitate stoneflies. By the looks of the fly, one would think it is a difficult fly to tie, but it is actually a fairly easy tie. Iso nymphs can swim incredibly fast and they emerge similar to stoneflies along the streamside and midstream boulders. The pattern is very versatile in that it is effective dead-drifted, swung, and jigged or twitched. I have done well with a cast directly across the stream above the targeted water with a downstream mend, tighten the line and begin very short, quick strips of line and/or rod tip twitches. You'll want to us the heaviest tippet you can get away with since the fish will sometimes almost take the rod out of your hand and a hook set typically results is a lost fly and fish.

Hook: Rear – TMC 300 #16 (cut off hook bend after rear is tied), Front – TMC 2488H #12 Thread: 6/0 UNI-Thread. wine

Rear tail and body: 3 ostrich herl feathers (2 black, 1 brown), tips for tails (spin/twist feathers with thread to reinforce materials)

Flashback: 1 strand of pearl flashabou

Rib: wine thread

Connection: 2X tippet tied in with several wraps up and down hook, thread rear hook up through the eye and secure tippet again using several wraps on top of hook shank, a touch of head cement over wraps to reinforce. Key is to make loop small, but also allowing plenty of movement.

Front body: Tungsten bead, Tie in steps – pearl flashabou, black thin skin (wing case), partridge feather by tip, and lastly the remaining ostrich herl feathers (make body in reverse order finishing with pearl flashabou pulled over thin skin wing case and whip finish). Finish fly with a drop of Clear Cure Goo or 5 minute epoxy to secure and add to the durability and looks of the fly.
