These include bank erosion, stream widening, excessive build up of silt, and excessive vegetation growth. The group has been gathering data over the past year. Once collected data have been studied, the working group will present findings and recommendations to the board. Several members of the chapter, led by President John Leonard, met recently on the banks of the Letort with Fish & Boat Commission new area fisheries manager Bryan Chikotas. During this 'get acquainted' meeting we briefed Bryan on our long term Letort study. Further meetings with F&BC staff and other Letort stakeholders are contemplated as we move through this important effort.


Cress Farm Dedication—Mission Accomplished By Dave Weaver


